


## FOREWORD

In the following pages we shall attempt to present life at Souther Field with its aviation cadets, officers, enlisted men and civilians.

It is our earnest hope that the photographs will appeal to our friends and relatives as well as serve to refresh our memories of Souther Field when the world is blessed again with peace.





## HISTORY OF SOUTHER FIELD

The property known as Souther Field during the first World War was originally part of the world's largest peach orchard. It was purchased by the citizens of Sumter County and deeded to the United States Government in 1917. An aviation field was constructed immediately and was used with its full quota until after the Armistice. The field was named in honor of Major Henry Souther of the United States Army who was a pioneer in the development of airplane engines.

The field was closed in 1921 and finally sold to Sumter County in 1928. It was used for county purposes until the present program was put in operation.


When the original field was completed it consisted of a brick and wooden warehouse with wooden siding, barracks and officers quarters for two thousand men, fifteen wooden hangers, hospitals, incinerator and numerous smaller buildings. The field was constructed for all-way landing. A system of macadam roads connected buildings and hangars.

Perhaps the most famous of fliers to come in contact with Souther Field is Charles A. Lindbergh. "Lindy" made his first solo flight from this field in a Curtiss "Jenny" which he purchased here at government auction when the field was closed.

More flying hours were available from Souther Field during the last war than from any other field in the United States. The reasons for this fact are; exceptional air conditions and almost perfect drainage. There is no record of a wind storm of any consequence in the past one hundred years of Americus' history. All buildings were removed from the post after the Armistice.

Work for the present school began December 1, 1940 by the Graham Aviation Company which had been granted a contract with the War Department to give primary training to Army Aviation Cadets. The first class of cadets arrived on March 22, 1941.
